

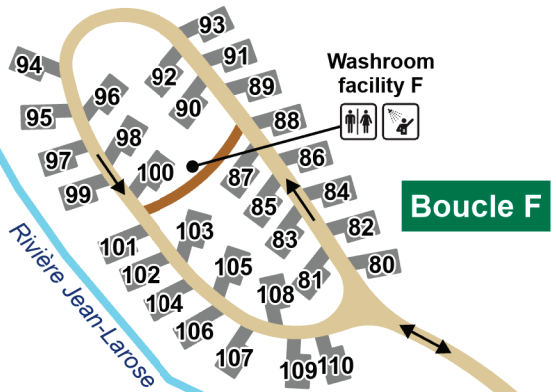

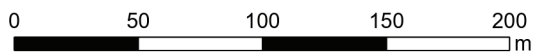

## INFORMATION FOR CAMPERS

- You can purchase **ice** and **firewood** at the registration booth.
- A **washer** and **dryer** are available in the visitor centre (\$).
- There are two **dump and fill stations**, located near Montagne sector and next to Loop B in de la Rivière sector.

### Check-in and check-out times

**Check-in** at the campsite **begins at 3:00 p.m.**

**Check-out** from the campsite **must be completed by 2:00 p.m.**

## 5 Good habits to follow when camping

Thank you, and enjoy your nature stay!



**Do not feed the animals**

**Store food out of their reach**

**Stay on the trails and in designated areas**

**Take your trash with you and keep the areas clean**

**Respect the peace and quiet of the area and observe the curfew**

## GENERAL RULES

### Number of occupants per campsite

- A campsite can accommodate six people, including the renter.
- Guests are permitted on campsites from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. The number of people on the site must never exceed 12.

### Number of units per site

- A campsite can accommodate two pieces of equipment, including a maximum of one registered camping unit for sleeping, without exceeding the site's designated boundaries.
- Picnic tables must remain in their designated spots, and fire pits must not be moved.

### Kitchen shelter

- The installation of a standard-sized (3.6 square metre (12 ft x 12 ft) or less) open-backed cooking shelter with removable sides is permitted on campsites. The entire setup (camping equipment and cooking shelter) must not exceed the boundaries of the site.

### Number of cars per site

- Each site can accommodate one car at no charge. Additional cars must be parked in designated areas set aside for this purpose.
- Parking along trails or playgrounds or in any other prohibited area is prohibited. Any vehicle found in these prohibited areas may be towed away at the vehicle owner's expense.

### Quiet hours

- Noise is permitted provided it cannot be heard from the access road to the campsite or from a neighbouring site. The use of any sound equipment (speakers, radios, phones, instruments, etc.) to play music, podcasts, radio shows, or any other audio content is not permitted.

### Curfew

- A curfew is in effect from 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. During this time, only the occupants of the campsite may be on the site. Whispering and walking by the occupants of the site are permitted.

### Generator and air conditioner

- Moderate use of a generator is permitted from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Moderate use of an air conditioner is permitted from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., provided occupants are in the unit. For animal welfare purposes, the presence of a dog is considered equivalent to the presence of an occupant and justifies the use of an air conditioner during these hours. However, a dog that barks, howls, or disturbs the well-being, peace, and safety of other visitors is not tolerated. If the situation is not promptly corrected, Sépaq reserves the right to ask the camper to leave the premises, with no possibility of a refund.

### Late arrival

- Camping equipment must be fully set up on the site one hour before curfew.

### Hammock

- Hammocks may be hung from trees adjacent to the campground. Installation must not damage the tree.

### Clothesline and tarp

- The use of clotheslines and tarps is permitted on campsites. They must be set up at the edge of the site, be temporary, not damage the trees, and be removed at the end of your stay.

### Lighting and spotlights

- The installation of low-intensity, amber-coloured lighting, required for safety reasons, is permitted on campsites. The installation must be placed directly on the site, must be temporary, must not damage trees, must be turned off when occupants go to bed, and must be removed at the end of the stay. Inappropriate ambient lighting, such as string lights, unnecessary lighting when campers are asleep, and spotlights, is prohibited.

### Portable showers and toilets

- The use of portable showers or toilets is permitted only if the wastewater is collected and disposed of at a waste disposal station.

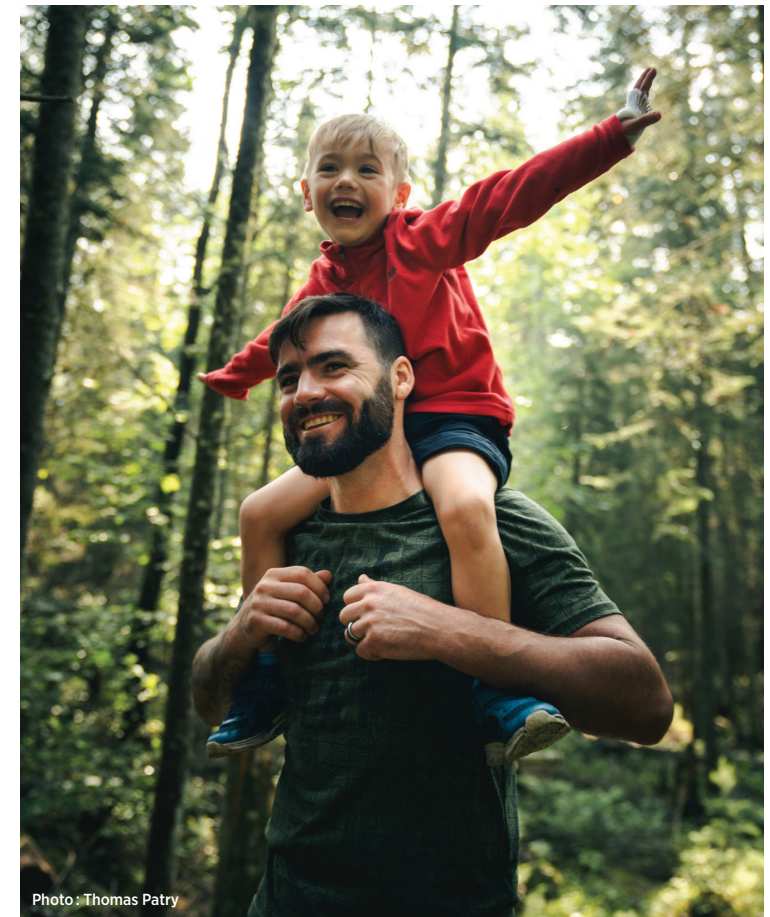

### Fireworks

- To preserve the peace and quiet of the area and prevent the risk of forest fires, fireworks are prohibited at all campgrounds.

### Campfires

- Campfires or cooking fires are permitted only in designated areas on your site and must be extinguished before bedtime. At all times, campfires must be supervised by a responsible person.
- Please note that depending on the fire danger index issued by SOPFEU, there may be a ban on open fires during your stay. Outdoor fires are prohibited on the premises when the fire danger index is at the extreme level. We encourage you to check the SOPFEU website and the on-site signage on the day of your arrival to determine the fire danger index.
- The Minister of Public Security, as well as the management of a national park or tourist establishment, may impose a fire ban at any time.

### Pets

- Only dogs are allowed. They must be kept on a leash. The person responsible must immediately pick up their pet's waste and dispose of it properly. Dogs that bark, howl, or disturb the well-being, peace, and safety of other visitors will not be tolerated. Dogs must never be left unattended in any type of camping equipment (tent, tent trailer, trailer, motorhome, etc.) in the absence of the person responsible for the dog or a designated surrogate.

### Consumption of alcohol, tobacco, and cannabis

### Electric motorcycles

- The use of electric motorcycles is prohibited throughout the entire territory.
