

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW - CAMPING

•Arrival: 3:00 p.m. - Departure: 2:00 p.m.


- You must carry your access authorization with you at all times.
- Drinking water: Water is potable at all distribution points on the various campsites. Drinking water is a precious commodity, so please use it responsibly.


Caution: Please note that the water at the Ferme Rioux Discovery and Visitors Centre is not safe for drinking. We suggest that you fill your water bottles at the campsite before you go out on the trails.

- Recreational vehicle dumping: The only RV dumping and filling station is available behind the Rivière-du-Sud-Ouest service centre.
- Firewood: Throughout the season, during opening hours, it is possible to buy wood at the Rivière-du-Sud-Ouest Visitors Centre. In high season, you also have the possibility of buying firewood in front of the sanitary block of the Rioux campsite or the Tombolo campsite between 7 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. To prevent pests, please do not bring in wood from outside and do not take wood out of the park. Collecting dead or any other type of wood within the park is prohibited.
- Visitors: If you have visitors, they must pay their entry fees and leave the park by 10:00 p.m.
- Music: Please use headphones if you'd like to listen to music while outdoors (a curfew is in place from 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.).
- Laundry: washer \$2, dryer \$2 (in \$1 coins).

CAMPSITE RULES

- To avoid attracting animals, never leave your food waste or leftovers around.
- Foot traffic damages the groundcover. Don't venture off paths or outside authorized areas.
- To maintain our peace and quiet, a curfew is in effect from 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. Moderate generator use is tolerated between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.
- A camping spot is authorized to hold up to 6 people (max. 4 adults in the traditional ready-to-camp format).
- A camping spot is authorized to hold up to 2 tents OR one licensed recreational vehicle OR 1 tent and 1 cook tent (no floor), space permitting.
- Up to two vehicles may be parked per camping spot if parking is authorized and accessible.
- Campfires or cooking fires are allowed where fire pits have been provided. However, these fires but must be watched at all times. Make sure you fully put out your fire before leaving or going to bed. To prevent pests, please do not bring in wood from outside and do not take wood out of the park. Collecting dead or any other type of wood within the park is prohibited.
- Please put your refuse in the proper containers.
- The installation of a tarp or rope clothesline is permitted within the limits of the site but must be removed after use.
- The maximum speed in camping sectors is 10 km/h.
- No animals are allowed, other than guide dogs and dogs on a leash in areas designated for this purpose. Please consult the framework rules and authorized areas in the Discovery Guide or at sepaq.com/animals and respect the signposting in this regard.

• Arrival: 5:00 p.m. Departure: 12:00 noon Please don't come before 5 p.m.


• Non-smoking: Ready-to-camp accommodations are non-smoking.

• No pets allowed.

YOUR DEPARTURE

- If possible, please send a text message with your ready-to-camp site number to 418-896-3117, to let us know you have left.
- Site condition: we ask that you please leave sites in the condition in which you found them. In other words, leave everything clean and tidy.
- Dishes: it is important to wash, dry and put away your dishes.
- Waste materials: dispose of your garbage and recycling at the nearest washroom facility.

Offenders may be charged additional cleaning fees.



SPEED LIMIT

Remember that the speed limit is 10 kph on the campgrounds and near the service areas.

Please comply with the speed limit, to ensure the safety of all park visitors.



LA COULÉE CAMPSITE

- **Directions:** La Coulée is a rustic campsite accessible on foot or by bike. It is located 1.3 km from the îlet au Flacon parking lot (at the eastern end of Saint-Fabien-sur-Mer) or, by sea kayak, 50 meters from the same parking lot. Saint-Fabien-sur-Mer is accessible via Highway 132 and the route de la Mer from Saint-Fabien. No luggage cart available for transporting equipment.
- **Kayak:** The launching area is located at l'Anse à Capelans. You will see a Québec flag on the beach opposite the campsite.
- Water: There are no onsite water supply points.
- Firewood: A dozen logs per night are included in your reservation. They are found in the camping shed. You can buy more firewood at the Rivière-du-Sud-Ouest Visitors Centre. You can also pay over the phone by calling 418 736-5035, ext. 0.
- **Toilets and showers:** There is a dry toilet near site no. 5, and showers are located in the washroom facilities at the other campsites.
- Garbage disposal: Recycling and garbage bins are located next to the pit latrine.
- Food bin: A bin with fasteners is set up on each site. Please keep your food in it and keep fasteners tightly closed to prevent attracting animals.

• Porc-Épic rest stop: For safety reasons, you cannot sleep in




- Water: There are no onsite water supply points.
