Le chafaud discovery centre

Located in the Chafaud building, the Discovery Centre is the starting point for planning your visit to the park's natural areas. Meet with a Naturalist Park Rangers and view the two exhibits: one on the park's history, fauna, flora and geology, the other on the story of the French in Percé's fishing industry during the 16th and 17th centuries.

Le Relais des Fous

Located right beside the Northern Gannet colony, a beautiful patio offering a quick bite to eat. Enjoy a meal and a local beer (Pit Caribou) while taking in the unique surroundings.



Pirate Duval's treasure hunt

Take part in a treasure hunting activity on Île Bonaventure! Go at your own pace and who knows? You might even find Pirate Duval's treasure hidden! The first section is located on the Les Colonies Trail and the second is on the Chemin du Roy Trail.



Resto des Margaulx

Housed in the former warehouse of the LeBoutillier company on lie Bonaventure, the park's restaurant is a great place to recharge your batteries or pick up a picnic lunch. On the menu: soups, salads, a wide selection of sandwiches, desserts, hot and cold beverages, and local beers.




The Northern Gannet colony

The sight of 200,000 birds nesting on Bonaventure Island, including the 110,000 individuals that make up the most accessible Northern Gannet colony in the world, will be the highlight of your visit. On site, a park naturalist will be available to answer your questions.

The LeBoutillier house

The LeBoutillier Brothers Management House holds all operational secrets of a historical Jersey fishing company. Come visit and immerse yourself in this storied location.





Protected marine zones

The marine area is made up of two zones with a wide variety of landscapes and organisms that are part of the park's conservation mission: a 100-metre strip of sea around Île Bonaventure and the intertidal zone (between the highest and lowest tides) around Percé Rock. A plan is currently being developed to protect these unique marine habitats. It will include an indicator of the marine zone's health, enabling the park to better manage access to the dive site based on the condition of protected areas.

Over 200 000 seabirds

Parc national de l'Île-Bonaventure-etdu-Rocher-Percé is home to the largest migratory bird sanctuary in North America. With more than 200,000 breeding birds from 11 different species, these colonies are sensitive to the disturbances caused by boats in the park waters. To best protect the birds, the park does important work by preparing documents, raising awareness and monitoring boating activities to encourage boaters and kayakers to adopt best practices.
